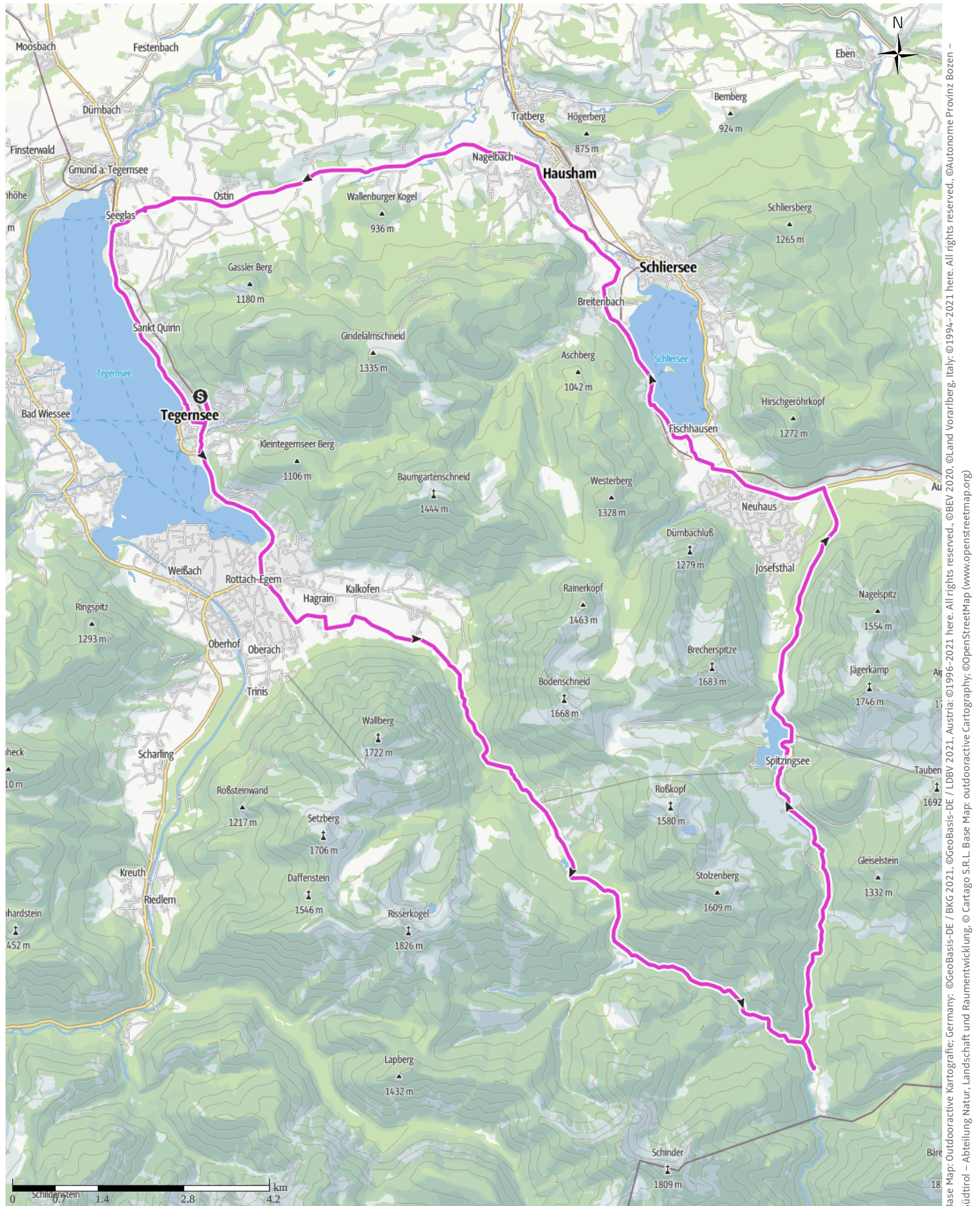

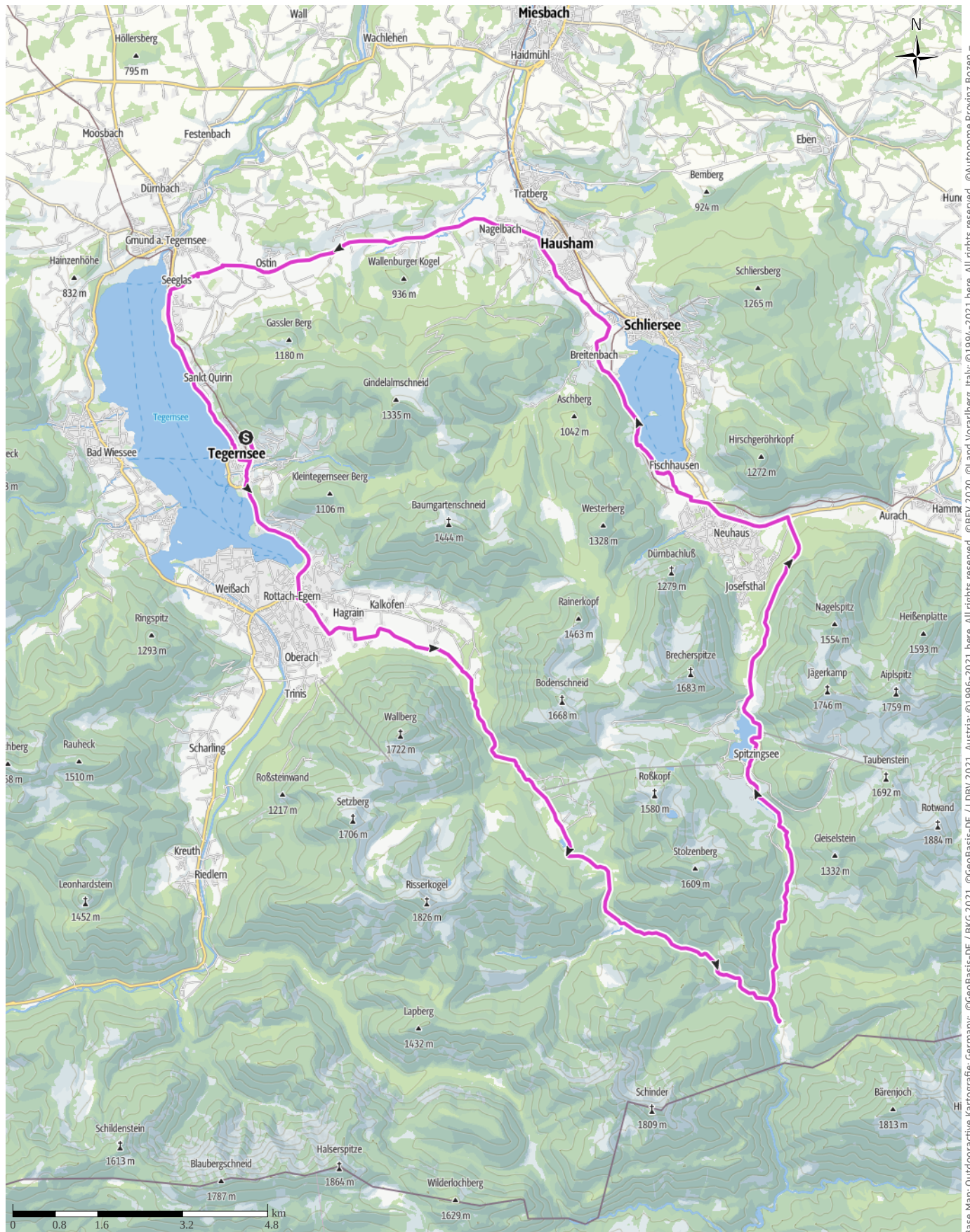

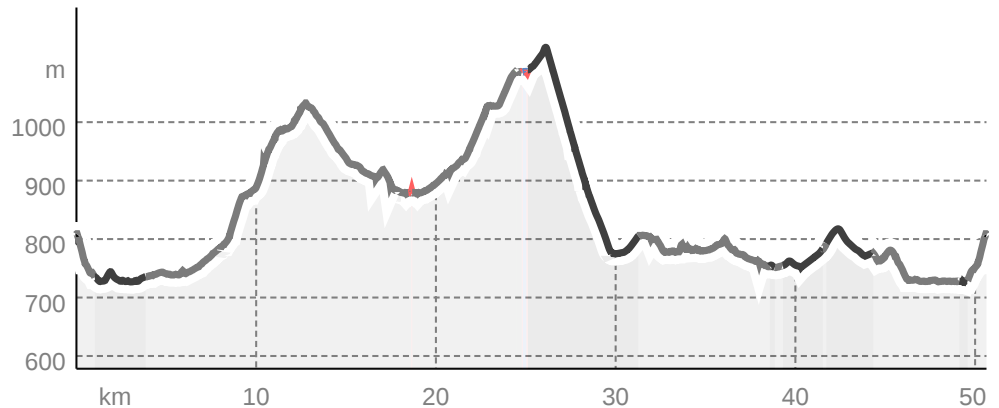

natural landscapes in the Bavarian Alps. Surrounded by dense mountain forests, clear alpine streams and majestic peaks, this varied cycling tour leads from Hotel DAS TEGERNSEE via Rottach-Egern into the peaceful valley and onwards to the Albert-Link-Hütte at Lake Spitzingsee.

The route is characterised by its pristine scenery and offers numerous opportunities to extend the tour according to your preferences – for example, continuing on to Lake Schliersee.

Roadbook

The tour starts directly at Hotel DAS TEGERNSEE and initially follows the lakeshore to Rottach-Egern. From there, continue along Valepper Straße towards Enterrottach. The first few kilometres are relatively flat before the ascent begins after around eight kilometres. Following the toll road, you steadily gain elevation. The first climb covers around 200 metres of elevation gain and is generally pleasant to ride. Accompanied by the Rottach River and surrounded by dense natural scenery, the route continues deeper into the Vallepp Valley. Along the way, a detour to the Rottach waterfalls is well worthwhile.

After approximately ten kilometres, you reach the Moni Alm, which is an ideal spot for a first break. From here, the route becomes increasingly peaceful. After another short climb, a roughly seven-kilometre descent leads through the Vallepp Valley, following the Weiße Valepp stream to the idyllic Forsthaus Valepp.

After the Forsthaus, the second climb begins. Over approximately eight kilometres, you gain around 300 metres in elevation. The gradient is noticeably gentler than the first ascent and follows a road closed to through traffic, leading through shady forests and later across open alpine meadows. With views of Stümpfling and Brecherspitz, you eventually reach Lake Spitzingsee.

At Lake Spitzingsee, the Albert-Link-Hütte or Blecksteinhaus are ideal places to stop for a break. If you would like to continue, the route leads via Spitzingsattel to the highest point of the tour at 1,129 metres. From there, the route is predominantly downhill towards Lake Schliersee.

Extend the tour

If you still have energy to spare, the tour can easily be extended.

From Lake Spitzingsee, the route descends towards Lake Schliersee, where there are numerous opportunities for a refreshing swim or a meal directly by the water.

For the return journey, there are two attractive options:

1. Via the Bodensee-Königssee Cycle Path back to Tegernsee – a scenic route through the foothills of the Alps.
2. Via the panoramic road above Lake Schliersee with spectacular views of the lake and surrounding mountains before continuing back towards Tegernsee. This option is particularly

recommended for road cyclists.

Both options turn the route into a varied full-day cycling tour.
