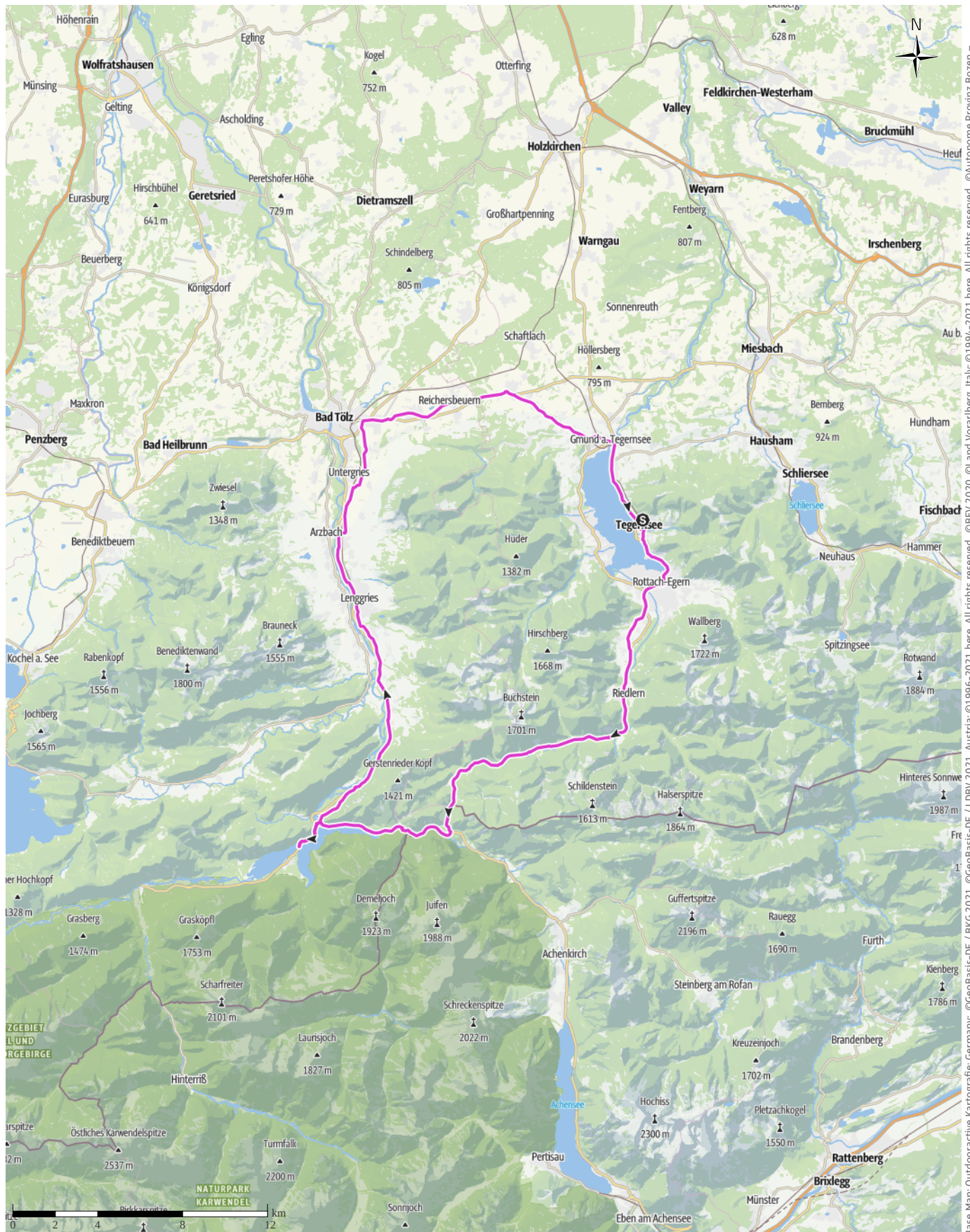

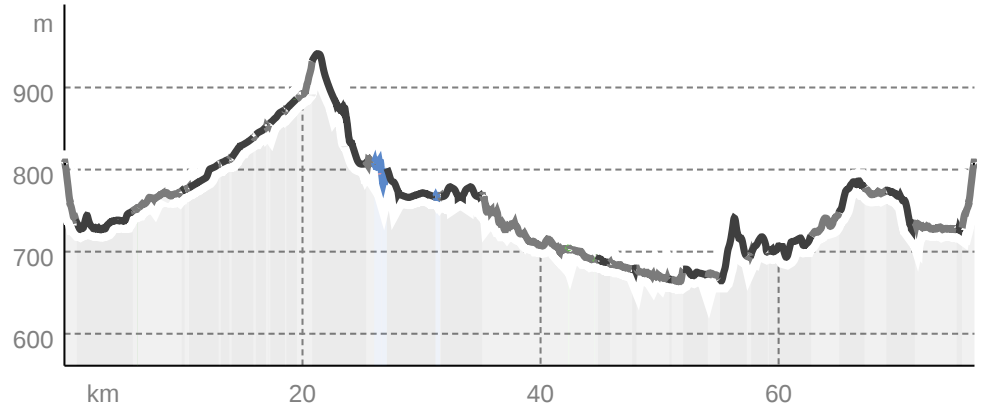

TEGERNSEE through the Tegernsee Valley, via Kreuth and over the Achen Pass to the Sylvenstein Reservoir. From there, the route continues along the Isar towards Lenggries and Bad Tölz before returning to Lake Tegernsee via Waakirchen and Gmund. Scenic mountain roads, clear alpine rivers and breathtaking landscapes make this a rewarding circuit through the Bavarian foothills of the Alps.

This varied road cycling tour leads from Hotel DAS

Roadbook

The tour starts directly at Hotel DAS TEGERNSEE and initially follows the lakeshore towards Rottach-Egern. From there, the route continues south through the Tegernsee Valley. Via Weißbach and Kreuth, you ride through the idyllic Weißbach Valley, surrounded by wooded mountain slopes, lush meadows and the peaks of the Tegernsee Alps. Beyond Kreuth, the ascent towards Achen Pass begins. The road winds its way through the Alpine foothills, climbing through dense mountain forests towards the pass. The gradient is moderate and well suited to road cycling. Around the Achen Pass, beautiful views of the surrounding mountains open up along the way. After crossing the Achen Pass, continue towards the Sylvenstein Reservoir. Before reaching Lake Achensee, turn onto the B307 and follow the road through the varied landscape of the Isarwinkel region. The route continues towards the Sylvenstein Reservoir and along the shores of the lake. The Sylvenstein Reservoir is one of the scenic highlights of the tour. Its turquoise waters lie impressively between the surrounding mountains, with its many winding bays giving it the appearance of a natural alpine lake. One of the most spectacular sections is the crossing of the distinctive Faller Klamm Bridge, which offers magnificent views across the reservoir and surrounding peaks. It is well worth stopping here for a short photo break. From the Sylvenstein Reservoir, the route initially follows the B13 towards Lenggries. The Isar continues to accompany you through the picturesque Isar Valley. Forested slopes, bright gravel banks and the river's clear waters create a wonderfully varied landscape. As you approach Lenggries, the valley gradually widens, revealing beautiful views of the surrounding foothills. From Lenggries, continue along the Isar towards Bad Tölz. The historic spa town makes an inviting stop along the way. The picturesque Marktstraße is particularly worth exploring, with its colourful Lüftlmalerei facades and beautifully preserved historic buildings. From Bad Tölz, the route turns back towards the Tegernsee Valley. Via Waakirchen and Gmund, you ride through the gently rolling foothills of the Alps towards Lake Tegernsee. Small villages, expansive meadows and open views of the mountains accompany you throughout the final section. Finally, you reach Lake Tegernsee via Gmund. With the lake and surrounding mountains providing a beautiful backdrop, the route comes to a memorable close as you return to Hotel DAS TEGERNSEE.
