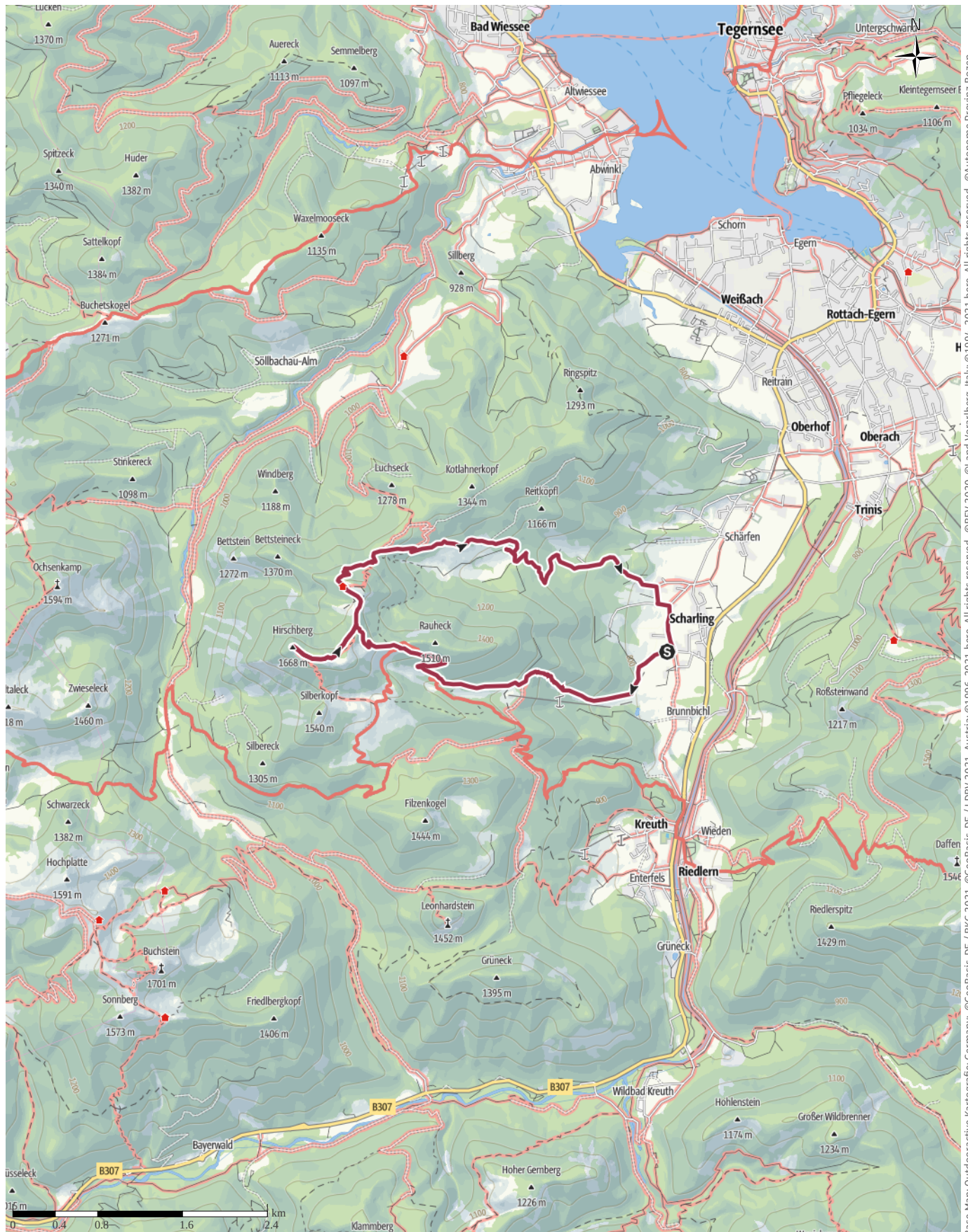

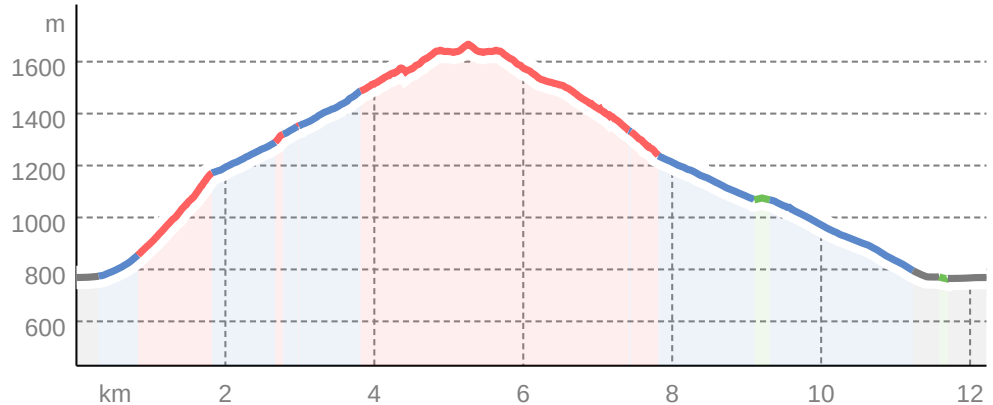

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panoramic mountains around Lake Tegernsee. The hike from the car park at the Hirschbergglifte leads through varied mountain forests to the traditional Hirschberghaus and onwards along alpine mountain trails to the summit. Once at the top, an impressive panorama opens up across the Tegernsee Valley and the surrounding peaks of the Mangfall Mountains, extending far into the Bavarian Alps on clear days.

Safety information

- Challenging mountain hike with approximately 910 metres of elevation gain.
- Sure-footedness and a good level of fitness are required.
- The upper sections include some narrow, rocky and steeper mountain trails.
- In wet, icy or snowy conditions, certain sections can become significantly more challenging.
- Check the current weather and trail conditions before setting out.

The Hirschberg is considered one of the most beautiful

- Allow sufficient time for both the ascent and descent.

Equipment

- Sturdy, ankle-high hiking boots with a good-grip sole
- Weather-appropriate, breathable clothing
- Sufficient drinking water and provisions
- Sun protection and sunglasses
- A small first-aid kit
- A lightweight rain or wind jacket in changeable weather
- Hiking poles can be particularly helpful on the descent
- Cash for the alpine huts

Roadbook

The hike begins at the car park at the Hirschberglifte in Scharling. Directly behind the ski lift, the trail turns left and climbs towards Hirschberg. Initially, the route follows a moderately ascending forest road before switching to a considerably steeper trail across the ski slope. A steady pace is recommended here. Further uphill, the trail becomes a pleasant forest road again and is well signposted towards Rauheckalm. As you gain elevation, the forest becomes more open, revealing the first beautiful views of Lake Tegernsee and the surrounding mountain landscape.

From Rauheckalm, the route continues uphill along a narrower trail. Passing between the alpine buildings, you continue towards Hirschberg. The terrain becomes increasingly alpine, with impressive views of Lake Tegernsee and the surrounding peaks opening up along the way.

At the ridge, you will reach a clearly signposted trail junction. From here, turn left and continue for around

20 minutes to the summit of Hirschberg at approximately 1,670 metres. At the top, an impressive panorama awaits, stretching across Lake Tegernsee and the peaks of the Bavarian Prealps.

After a break at the summit, the descent initially follows the same route back to the trail junction. Here, follow the signs towards Hirschberghaus. After a short section along the ridge, you will reach the scenic Hirschberghaus, which is an ideal place to stop for refreshments.

From Hirschberghaus, a narrow trail leads directly past the hut and downhill towards Scharling. The descent is partly steep and requires sure-footedness. After around 30 minutes, you will reach the material cableway and then follow the forest road to the right. Depending on your preferred route, you can take a short trail as a shortcut or follow the slightly longer forest road. Both routes eventually meet again.

From here, an easy forest road leads downhill towards Scharling. Once in the village, turn right onto the second road, Rauheckweg, and follow it back to the car park at the Hirschberglifte.

If you would like to stop for refreshments after the hike, you can round off the experience with a visit to Hirschbergalm.
