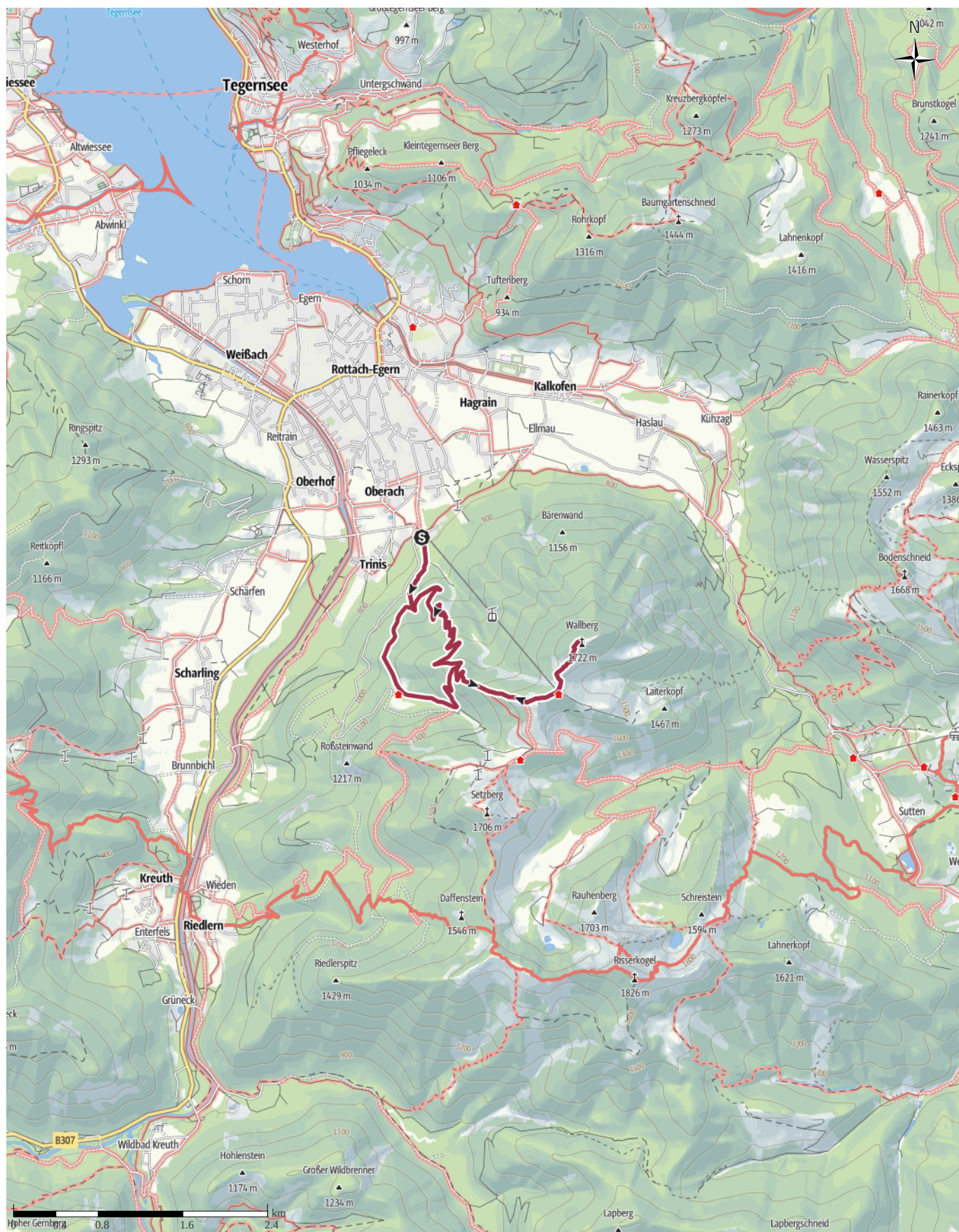

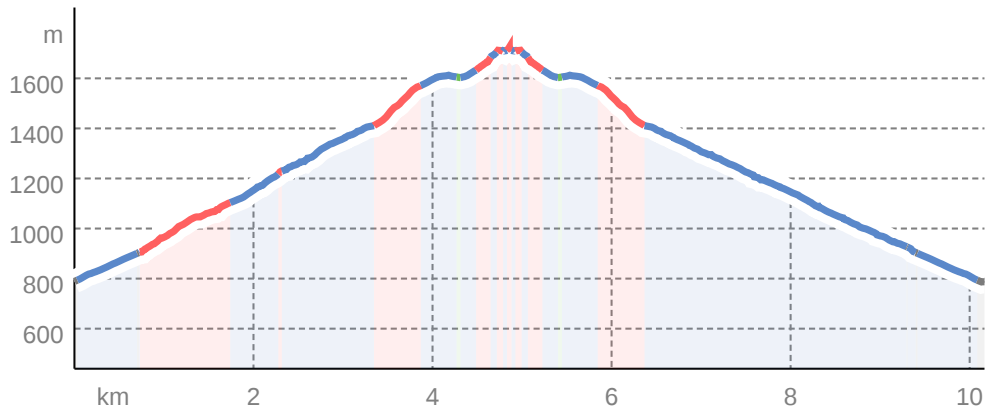

The Wallberg is the landmark of the Tegernsee Valley and one of Bavaria's best-known panoramic mountains. The classic circular hike from the Wallbergbahn valley station leads through varied mountain landscapes, past traditional alpine huts and up to one of the region's most spectacular viewpoints. Whether you choose to hike up for a sporting challenge or take the Wallbergbahn for a more leisurely experience, Wallberg offers something for every mountain enthusiast.

Safety information

- The ascent to the summit from the Wallbergbahn mountain station follows narrow, partly rocky mountain trails and requires sure-footedness as well as a good level of fitness.
- In wet, snowy or icy conditions, particularly the summit sections can become slippery. Check the current weather and trail conditions before setting out.

- The hike partly passes through alpine terrain. Allow sufficient time and do not underestimate the length or elevation gain of the tour.
- Please stay on the marked hiking trails and be considerate of grazing livestock and other mountain users.

Equipment

- Ankle-high hiking or mountain boots with a good-grip sole
- Weatherproof layered clothing and a rain jacket
- Sufficient drinking water and a small snack
- Sun protection (sunscreen, sunglasses and a hat)
- Hiking poles – particularly recommended for the long descent
- A fully charged mobile phone for emergencies
- Optional: Binoculars or a camera to capture the impressive panoramic views from the summit
- Cash for the alpine huts

Roadbook

The hike begins at the Wallbergbahn valley station in Rottach-Egern. From here, the trail initially climbs along well-maintained hiking paths towards Wallbergmoosalm.

The first section leads through shady mountain forests, following forest roads and woodland trails. As you gain elevation, beautiful views of Lake Tegernsee and the surrounding peaks of the Mangfall Mountains open up time and again. After around one and a half hours, you will reach Wallbergmoosalm, an ideal spot for your first break.

From Wallbergmoosalm, the trail continues uphill along scenic mountain paths and switchbacks. With every metre of elevation, the views become more impressive, revealing new perspectives of Lake

Tegernsee and the surrounding mountain landscape.

Continuing uphill, you will first reach the famous Wallbergkircherl, picturesquely situated high above Lake Tegernsee. Just a few steps away is the well-known paragliding launch site. On clear days, you can watch colourful paragliders silently gliding above the lake and valley.

Shortly afterwards, you will reach the Wallbergbahn mountain station and Wallberg Panorama Restaurant. From here, the final section leads to the actual summit of Wallberg. The trail becomes narrower and partly more rocky, requiring sure-footedness and sturdy hiking shoes.

Once you reach the summit, a spectacular 360-degree panorama awaits. The view stretches across the entire Lake Tegernsee, the Mangfall Mountains and, on clear days, as far as the Karwendel and the Central Alps.

For the return journey, the trail winds its way through the mountain forest, running parallel to the Wallbergbahn before leading back to the valley station. Gasthof Alpenwildpark is an ideal place for a final refreshment before returning to the hotel.

Experience Wallberg by Cable Car

If you would like to shorten the hike or avoid the most demanding section of the ascent, you can conveniently take the Wallbergbahn to the mountain station.

From there, Wallbergkircherl, the summit area and the most scenic viewpoints can be reached within a short walk. A shorter hike or a descent on foot back to the valley station are also popular alternatives.
